Success Stories

STEPPING FORWARD TO SELF DEPENDENCY



A girl named Manisha D/o Shri Bharat Singh hails from village Panchli and comes from a very poor family which consist of six members. She is the member of Sarsawati Adolescent girls Group, formed under SAKHI project, and takes active participation in all the project activities. She also took part in the Backyard Poultry training programme and capacitated and enhanced her knowledge and skill in this trade.

She was one of the beneficiaries of hen distribution and got two chickens from MSS to raise livelihood option. But unfortunately, one chicken died. She immediately took the decision to break open her piggy bank and with that saving, she brought five more chickens. It shows that the training executed to the participants was very motivating and fruitful.

She is doing her studies and simultaneously doing backyard poultry at small scale and she is determined to expand it in near future. She has become a role model and motivator for peer girls groups. Her interest shows the dignity of the work no matter big or small. She thanks UKSVK and MSS for providing them an opportunity to become skilful.

Success Stories

SPIRIT OF DETERMINATION



Km. Sana D/o Mr. Anees lives in village Jani Khurd who belongs to a poor and conservative family. She has two brothers and one sister, her parents work as daily wage labourers in the agriculture field to sustain the family.

Sana was approached by the SAKHI project staff and counselled to form an adolescent group in her community to tap the opportunity of learning skills by associating with SAKHI project. She inspired other girls and motivated them and eventually formed a group named '786 Adolescent Girls Group'. She actively took part in all the project activities and was elected as 'Sakhi' of the group.

Sana was good at her studies but her family situation made her to hang up her school bag reluctantly when she was in class VII. But after linking with Meerut Seva Samaj under the SAKHI project, she was capacitated and determined to continue her studies. Parents were not supportive to fulfil her ambition. She approached Smt. Renu Rani, the instructor of SAKHI project, to counsel her parents on the importance of education. She convinced Sana's parents and sensitized them on its benefits and educational schemes run by the govt. Eventually Sana took admission in class X.

COVID-19 brought down the dowry and marriage expenses, realizing this situation her relatives pressurized her to get married. She vehemently opposed this idea with the support of her parents, as she is below 18, which caused a family quarrel. She expressed her mind to become a lawyer and if they compel her to get married now she would complaint to the police, thus she managed to change their mind. At present she is learning basic computer course.

During COVID-19, Km. Sana has stitched 100 masks and



distributed in the community and also made the people aware to wear mask and adapt COVID-19 appropriate behaviour. She, with her group members cleaned the surrounding.

She equipped herself with skill trainings in association with MSS. She has become an inspiration for the dropout adolescent girls. She appeals girls to give priority to education, which is the foundation of all development.

She along with her family thanks MSS for giving them a platform to outbreak the fetters of unwanted social norms.

‘RESPONSE TO COVID-19 CALL’



Mr. Satveer is a rickshaw puller from Modipuram Area of Meerut. His family comprises of his mother, wife and three daughters.

People from his area pull rickshaws or do other hard labour to earn daily bread and support their family. Total Lockdown which was imposed on 21st March 2020 made them jobless and go to bed on an empty stomach.

Mr. Satveer said the people were anxious and terrified as there was no income to support their family and sustain their lives. The local administration came forward to help them with the cooked meals packets

for few days. During the survey Meerut Seva Samaj identified his location and reached out to him and the families around him. They were provided with dry ration kits, which was enough to have their meals for 15 to 20 days, and safety kits for their survival. The volunteers of MSS also taught them covid appropriate behaviour.

Mr. Satveer has given his feedback on the quality and quantity of the ration given to them. The labours expressed their thanks towards CRS, Caritas India and implementer Meerut Seva Samaj for identifying and supporting them with dry ration kits and safety kits.


