MSS has a Board of 16 members headed by the Bishop of Meerut as its President and a team of dedicated work force to support its aims. THE YEAR 2015-16

Apart from our general programs such as self help group formation, women empowerment, income generation, promotion of education, health and hygiene, immunization of new born and pregnant women, polio eradication etc., during the year 2015-16 special focus was paid on all round empowerment of Adolescent girls and women in our target areas. Keeping this fact in mind, the concerned projects were formulated and activities carried out :

SAKHI PROJECT APPROVED BY U.K.S.V.K., AGRA:

The three year project titled “SAKHI” (Strengthening Adolescents’ Knowledge, Women’s Rights & Health and Income) approved by Uttara Kendra Samaj Vikas Kendra (UKSVK), Agra is smoothly being implemented in 10 villages in Rohta Block in the district of Meerut. The project completed two years on 31st March 2016. Different empowerment programs meant for adolescent girls such as Promotion of Education, Re-admission of drop outs in the schools, Trainings on Life skill, Tailoring, Beautician and Computer learning, General & Health Awareness, Awareness on puberty changes as well as Psychological changes among the girls, Government welfare programs meant for girls, Training on Domestic Violence Act etc. were the focus areas of this project. Under the project there are 46 adolescent girls groups with membership of 1345.

Objective wise activities conducted during the period 2015-16 are as under:

2. Decrease in number of girls who marry or give birth before the age of 18

Animators visited all the homes of adolescent girls in the area and discussed towards promotion of different programs relating to adolescent girls. Total around 1300 families were visited.

Five Lobbying meetings held with government departments and other NGOs on stoppage of child marriage. Total 66 members participated. All the participants offered support in this matter.

3. Educating adolescent girls on reproductive and sexual health

Conducted six meetings in six villages which were participated by 146 Adolescent girls on topic 'Human body and its biological nature'.

4. Exposure visit to the vicinity by ado. girls

Arranged three exposure visits of the girls to the places like banks, post offices, Public Health Centers, Anganwadi Center etc. Total 132 girls had participated in these visits.

Conducted 12 training programs titled "Jago Sakhi" in all the target villages with the support of government personnel. By these trainings 120 girls were benefited.

Topics were: Bank savings, Different welfare and development programs of the government, Insurance schemes, Scholarships for girls students, art of living etc.

Conducted 10 workshops on how and where to file FIR, RTI, Opening of bank account etc. and their objectives. Total 145 participated in these workshops. The participants had also got opportunity to fill the model forms in these workshops.

5. Stay in School Concept

Four meetings titled “Girls Friendly Session” involving parents, teachers and adolescent girls held wherein topics such as re-admission of drop out, need of education for girl children, improvement in toilet facilities at homes and schools etc. were discussed.

Conducted 12 teachers sensitization programs one each in 12 schools. Total 63 school teachers had participated in these programs. The teachers were requested for keeping punctuality in school timings so that more time can be spared for teaching. Also requested to take extra care in the studies of weak children and assist the students for availing all the government benefits meant for the school going girls.

6. Legal literacy and advocacy campaign "Me and My Friend"

Follow up trainings of project staff held on "Adolescent girls right & its realization" and other legal rights.

Conducted 12 trainings on Domestic Violence Act 2005 and distributed relevant IEC materials. 338 girls participated in these trainings.

7. Sensitization of boys against gender injustice and violence against girls/ women

Five trainings for boys regarding relationship with girls held in the target area which were participated by 150 boys. The boys were also given training on life skill.

Impact:

The project designed to empower the adolescent girls has evoked good response among the adolescent girls of 10 villages in Rohta Block of Meerut District. During this period, a lot of improvements have been brought in the life of adolescent girls in the area. Total 1345 adolescent girls living in the project area are enrolled under this project. The programs have addressed many questions raised in the project objectives such as enhancement of literacy, awareness on different programs of government, knowing biological changes among girls and boys, hygiene during menstrual period, income generation, enhancement of confidence level, capacity building, decision taking process, leadership quality etc. The program "Training on Life Skill" (Art of Living) included in the project has made remarkable changes among the girls as it will definitely be helpful to the girls to have a bright family life in the future.

The confidence level of the girls has improved and leadership quality among them has also emerged. The attendance of teachers and students in schools has improved. The teachers are giving extra time for improvement of weak children.

The girls and their family members understand the bad effects of child marriage, as a result child marriage has been reduced by 80%. The parents are careful of the health of girl children too. Many families have built toilets at homes and not allowing female members for defecating in the field. Awareness on HIV/AIDS has increased and cautious of this disease. The girls learned the methods of filing of RTI/FIR at appropriate places. Awareness on Domestic violence Act 2005 and other legal rights has increased among the girls and other villagers. The domestic violence in the target villages has reduced by 20%.

Forty girls who have acquired skills of computer operation, tailoring, embroidery/croshia and beautician course are engaged in job work and earning to meet their day to day expenditure and have savings too. The kitchen gardening program is also an effective tool to produce & consume pure and fresh vegetables at their own homes.

105 Girls opened bank accounts and could save some money in these accounts. The girls visit banks and government offices for different works. Many dropout girls have rejoined in the school and continuing their schooling. The program also inspired many girls to go for higher studies after completing local education. They themselves apply through internet for higher studies and applying for government employments.

The girls are more careful of hygiene particularly during menstrual period. They also advocate about need of hygiene in family and outside. About 70% girls are using sanitary pads. They seek all the health entitlements from the PHCs and the services of ANMs, ASHA etc. are maximum utilized. They are also cautious of eco friendly environment and propagate in the area for the same. Many families have purchased solar lanterns for use at homes.

EMANCIPATION OF RURAL WOMEN AND ADOLESSENT GIRLS IN MEERUT AND BAGHPAT DISTRICTS APPROVED BY MANOS UNIDAS, SPAIN:

Implementation of this project funded by our donor MANOS UNIDAS started in the month of January 2015 is going on in 36 villages of Meerut & Baghpat districts. The activities carried out under this project during the reporting period are as under:

- As usual awareness meetings had been organized one each in all the target village. Total around 1400 persons participated in these meetings.
- The group meetings are held once in every month by all the groups. Different village issues relating to development and empowerment of women are taking place in these meetings.
- Organized one interface meetings in the month of June 2015 with PRI members. Also organized such meetings with VHNSC, VEC, AWW, Bank and Block Officers one each in all the target villages. We also

invited the teachers of nearby government schools and private schools to participate in the interface meeting. All the participants offered their support for proper implementation of the project in the respective villages.

- All the self help group members were imparted different income generating methods in the month of April & May 2015. Thus some types of income generating programs such as Buffaloes rearing, petty shops, agriculture etc. 76 persons are engaged in this program.

- Sensitizing the girls and parents:

This program was conducted in the months of June & July 2015. Apart from the girls, their parents were also motivated to contribute towards the program . One sensitization meeting in each village was organized. The contents of the meeting were: need of education among girls, admission of girl children in the school, drop out, need for readmission of drop-out in schools, liberty of women and girl, health facilities with PHC etc. As a result of our motivation 844 girls and their parents joined in these meetings.

Environment Day celebration

- Block wise Environment Day was celebrated in the month of June 2015. In this program the villagers were encouraged to plant more and more trees for the eco-friendly life of village populace. Also advocated for rain harvesting, maintaining of more and more water bodies in the villages, organic farming, use of solar equipments, use of biogas plants and smokeless ovens in homes etc.



Health Awareness Camp

- Towards promotion of community health, conducted health camps in all the target villages, one each during the reporting period. Total 1260 persons benefitted through these camps. Topics dealt in these camps were : Seasonal diseases, home remedies, herbal medicines, need of immunization among pregnant women and new born, HIV/AIDS etc. Also awareness on breast feeding was imparted in these meetings. Besides, meetings on Reproductive Child Health were also organized at block level in all the blocks in the month of January 2016.

- Life skill and personality Development program was held on block wise in the month of November & December 2015. Total 235 girl members had participated in this program. The topics dealt in these programs were: Positive thinking, confidence

building, stress management, dressing, role of education, health conscious, safe and nutritious food, time management, money management etc.

- Block wise Meetings of adolescent girls with parents were held in all the blocks wherein the Parents, Girls and Project staff with group leaders had participated. In these meetings, the parents were motivated for facilitating and sending each and every girl child to school under the scheme "Right to Education" promulgated by the government.

- A two days sensitization cum capacity building program was conducted for the group leaders in the month of January 2016. It was conducted in two batches. One batch was held at Baghpat area and the 2nd batch was held at MSS. While at Baghpat the program was attended by 52 persons, at MSS 88 persons participated. The contents were of SHG management, Selection of issues and solutions, Government schemes, SHG documentation, Bank Linkage etc.



Capacity building of Group Leaders

- Vocational courses for adolescent Girls:

Two regular training centers of duration of 6 months each for tailoring and beautician courses were organized with 20-25 girl students each at a time. So far 184 girls have been trained on beautician and 79 girls trained on tailoring. 166 girls who have gained skill in tailoring and beautician have taken up job and are earning bit. The costs of all the raw materials required for taking up the courses were born by the girls.

- Vocational courses arranged through Bank:

MSS got in touch with Syndicate Bank who are organizing free vocational courses for unemployed youths, particularly for girls. With this arrangement we got admitted some unemployed youths of villages Aterna and Meharmati for the courses of Mobile Repairing and Computer learning.

Impact:

Group members who were in urgent need of money could meet their requirements by availing the loan from groups' savings. Leadership has emerged among the group members. Group leaders themselves maintain the records of group activities. They speak openly with village VIPs and other government authorities and bargain for better amenities in the schools, hospitals and in the villages. The women, who have never shared platforms with others, feel bold and participate in different programs. Considerable improvement is visible in the target area with regard to sanitation. More than 80% of women and girls are using sanitary pads. Parents are intentionally giving less work load to girls and also giving them time for doing school works at homes. Among the group members, the unity and networking spirit has emerged.

Certain issues such as Ration card making, Aadhar Card making, Pension, Opening of bank accounts, repair of drainage, brick pavement, education and health related program are being taken care by the group members in consultation and assistance with MSS project staff.

With the support and assistance of project staff, 45 groups have opened their accounts in the banks and transaction started.

Some of the girls who have taken up job after completing 6 months beautician or tailoring courses are supporting their families besides personal savings. Simultaneously, the girls are also attending schools/higher educational institutions as per advice of project staff. These girls are now allowed easily to participate and support the program as the results of the project activities are found encouraging by the parents. The petty income generating programs have improved the economic condition of such members. The members have developed saving habits and hence they have always some money in their custody to meet any emergency in homes.

Sanitation and hygiene in the homes have improved. Women are working as agent of sanitation and encouraging others for working on "Swachh Bharat" appeal. The Villagers cooperate and extend assistance to health staff when they come for immunization and other health related activities.

EMANCIPATION OF RURAL WOMEN UNDER BACHRAON & KAZIKHERA PARISHES APPROVED BY B.C.I., ITALY:

This project supported by Conferenza Episcopale Italiana started in January 2012 has continued in the same 20 villages under Kazikhera and Bachraon Parishes. The objective of this project was to bring the adolescent girls and young mothers in the main stream of life with full of awareness on health, education and need of empowerment and how to access the government welfare schemes etc.

Though the third installment was received late, the programs started immediately on receipt. Other than group activities, awareness programs, health camps, workshops, tailoring centers, skill training & income generating programs meant for the group members were also incorporated during the third year.

Following are the activities carried out during the year under this project:



Community Mobilization meeting

- Conducted community mobilization meetings, one each, in all the 20 villages which were attended by total 596 persons.
- Organized a workshop cum seminar for adolescent girls and mothers. Total 120 persons participated in this program. This workshop provided opportunities to the participants to share their livelihood experience each other in the presence of project staff. The project staff facilitated all the arrangements for this program.

- Another program "Sharing of maturity" meant for adolescent girls and their parents were organized, one in each village. In this program the adolescent girls were

- explained about the biological changes taking places during adolescent and youth period. Total 20 programs were conducted which benefited total 715 persons consisting of adolescent girls and their parents.
- Organized gender equity awareness camps, one in each village. These camps facilitated the girls and other participants regarding need of gender equation in homes, schools, work place and in society. Total 792 persons attended these camps.
- Arranged two workshops one in each unit for teachers and community health workers, which were attended by total 90 persons. The topics dealt in these workshops were Maturity and Behavioural changes among the girls. The participants will impart awareness on the subject to girls in schools and homes.
- Conducted total 40 health awareness camps @ two camps in each village. Total 1135 persons benefitted through these camps. Services of Doctors and ANMs (Auxiliary Nursing Midwives) of nearby Public Health Centers were availed for conducting vaccination of children and pregnant women and distribution of essential medicines. The common topics dealt in these camps were :



Class on menstrual system



Workshop on health



Health Camp

- Need of different vaccinations
- Mother and child health care
- HIV-AIDS
- Balanced Diet
- Necessity of breast feeding to the new born
- Care of the new born
- Seasonal diseases
- Home remedies and herbal medicines.

Training Programs:

During this period different training programs were organized as under :-

1. Two days follow up training to project staff on SHG and other relevant matters.
2. Two days legal awareness training to group leaders which benefited total 120 leaders.

3. Two days awareness training on HIV/AIDS to project staff.
4. Training on puberty changes to adolescent leaders in all the villages, one each, which were attended by total 188 persons.
5. Leadership trainings to all the group leaders, one each, in all the villages which were attended by 190 persons.
6. One day training to community leaders on home remedy and herbal medicines which were participated by total 205 persons.

Our six monthly regular course of tailoring program continued in both the centers of Bachraon and Kazikhera which totally benefited total 160 adolescent girls during the year, as each batch had 40 girls. All these girls were given certificates after completing the course.



Tailoring & Embroidary course

MSS also arranged two skill trainings of Broom making and Bangle designing six batches in each trade so as to equip the beneficiaries to earn extra income by starting their own units individually or collectively. Total 12 batches of 30 persons i.e. six in each unit were conducted which altogether benefitted total (12x30) 360 persons. While the broom making program was of 15 days, the bangle designing program was of 20 days.

In addition to the old self help groups functioning in the project area, 9 fresh SHGs were formed during the reporting year with membership of 110 women/adolescent girls. All these new groups have opened their accounts with nearby Prathma Bank. These groups altogether have a total saving of Rs.1,11,300/- out of which an amount of Rs.13,000/- have been availed by four group members for starting income generating programs.

ECO-BASED DISASTER RISK REDUCTION PROJECT APPROVED BY CARITAS INDIA:

This three year project funded by Caritas India is being implemented in 11 flood threatened backward villages in two blocks of Laksar and Khanpur in Haridwar district. The implementation of this project was gracefully started in the month of September 2015. The goal of this project is to strengthen the eco system in all these villages in such a manner that it can reduce the risk of frequent flood and damages and at the same time to improve the livelihood condition of the poor people living in the area.



Launching of ECO DRR project

As a first step all the project staff i.e. one coordinator and four facilitators were appointed and Baseline Survey of all the identified villages had been carried out. The launching

program of the project was organized by Caritas India on 30th October 2015 in association with MSS and other partners of the region. Different state VIPs including Uttara Khand Environment Minisiter Mr. Rajindra Agarwal had participated in the program. All the eminent guests emphasized on the need for implementation of the project in the area and offered their supports.

Participatory Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA):

The project staff were given two days orientation program at Gorakhpur by Caritas India and thereafter survey of all the villages was carried out with the support of target group wherein different data have arrived and on the basis of these data different plans have been chalked out.

Since all the government welfare benefits and subsidies are delivered to the beneficiaries only through Aadhar cards as per norms of the government, MSS intervened with the concerned agency of the area "Be-Technology" and organized special Camps for preparing Aadhar cards of the target group which benefited total 1498 persons.



Awareness meeting on Risk Transfer

Awareness programs on Risk Transfer were carried out in all the villages. Total 21 such awareness programs were conducted which attended by total 518 villagers.

Conducted one Awareness Training to the students of nearby Bhagwan Singh Inter College on the roles of Eco-System and its advantages.

Conducted meeting with Govt. department for rapport building for the proper implementation of the program.

Also formed 7 Self Help Groups in the project area under this project and process for formation of other groups are under way.

Impact:

All the programs conducted in the project area have evoked good response among the target groups and they have extended whole hearted support to MSS in implementing this important project meant for their safety and livelihood.



Liaisoning with Govt. departments

People's awareness on different safety measures has increased and following the different tips of safety methods imparted to them with regard to their property and crops. Seven Self Help Groups with membership of 95 have been formed and are functioning in the target area.

The target group is eager to enroll their children in the school and also decided to reroll their drop-out girls and boys in the next academic session. They also avail the services of nearby Public Health Centers when fall sick.

Social issues confronted by the efforts of group members under this project:

Date 15-11-2015

Usually in villages whenever major electric fault occurs, the authorities take several months to rectify the fault leaving the poor villagers without electricity. But in the above case what happened is that after waiting for over one month the village women under the leadership of Ms. Sumen, Mamta, Renu, Kusum & Santosh went with written complaints to the District Magistrate and then to the concerned Tehsil Office and protested in front of their offices. As a result, the officers advised the concerned SDO of Electricity Department for rectification of the transformer quickly. Thus on 5-1-2016 a new transformer of higher capacity was installed in place of the defective transformer and electricity restored. Around 50 women most of them from SC community were there in the protest group.

Issue Handicapped person & Poverty

Sudesh is an 18 years old girl from a poor family in Alipur village. They are four sisters and Sudesh is the eldest but handicapped. Her father is also handicapped and hence family's situation was very bad. Due to poverty Sudesh could not continue her studies after completing middle class education and was at home doing homely work. The group leaders who are from the area approached the family and advised Sudesh's parents to send her for attending Beautician course arranged by MSS. Being handicapped, firstly the parents under-estimated Sudesh and did not allow her to go for the course. Because of repeated suggestion by the group members, her parents at last agreed to send Sudesh for the course and she successfully completed the 6 months course of Beautician. She is now employed with a beauty parlor in nearby area and earning around Rs.4000.00 per month. This situation has enhanced the confidence of Sudesh and her family. The family is very happy in her income and are also hopeful that Sudesh can lead a happy life in the future.

3. Name of villages Azampur
Block Rohta

Issue Education - Drop out

Four girls namely Pinky, Sumen, Sonam & Reena of different poor families in Azampur village had stopped their education after completing class VII because of poverty. The parents were of the opinion to marry off these girls after few years. The group

members identified these girls and advised their parents to send them to schools. But the parents were not ready to send them to schools because of poverty. The group members approached the School Management Committee and requested them to grant scholarships to these girls and also give them fees relief and books free of cost. The committee agreed and allowed all the four girls to rejoin in next classes. Last year all these girls joined in the school and are continuing their education.

Ms. Komal Rani of Village Madhi is a member of Adolescent Girls Groups formed by Meerut Seva Samaj. She could gain good knowledge on gynecology related cases by attending different health camps conducted by MSS, required for taking care of pregnant and lactating mothers. She decided to impart this knowledge to all the pregnant, lactating and other women in her village. Accordingly she identified all such women in her village and imparted her knowledge to all these members for taking care and to avoid problems like bleeding, swelling, itching, care of new born, care before and after delivery, need of iron tablets during pregnancy, balanced diet, need of timely check up, need of institutional delivery. She also informed them about the health benefits and monetary benefits available at health centers and government departments.

Ms. Komal's efforts for creating awareness were very much helpful to the women and they all praise her for her help. She is a committed group member to work for the progress of the society.

Celebration of International Women's Days:

International women's day was celebrated on 8th of March 2016 in the premises of St. Peters Church, Meerut wherein the women and adolescent girls of our different target villages of districts Meerut and Baghpat were gathered. Also some village Pradhans were also joined in the gathering. In this function about 700 women, adolescents girls and others participated.

The Function was inaugurated by MSS Director Rev. Fr. John Chiman, flagging off the rally of the participants which marched through main Sardhana Road, Adarshnagar colony, Khirva road, New Sainik colony and reached back to St. Peter's Church compound where the program was held.



The theme of this year's celebration was "Pledge for Parity", the objective of which is to bring equality among male and female in all socio, economic aspects and encourage gender equity in the community.

Rev. Fr. Demasis, Asstt Director of MSS welcomed the audience and the honorable guests and expressed his gratitude for their valuable presence. He thanked the gathering coming from far away villages. Thereafter a beautiful prayer dance was performed by the girl children of St. Peter's School. Afterwards Ms. Ruhama Ahmad, Managing Director of Golden Heart Academy, Meerut addressed the audience about the importance of women's day, describing the women's struggle in factories, homes and other working



places in the past and to overcome such situations in the year 1908 on 8th March a movement was organized in America. To commemorate this incident, every year on 8th March International Women's Day is being observed throughout the world. She has emphasized that both men and women should take decisions on mutual consent in the family and outside, but unfortunately today this has become

the right of only men and it is possible only when women is empowered themselves. She continued that women should not be feminist, but should get deserving dignity in the family and at large in the country. Another prominent speaker Mrs. Atul Sharma spoke on empowerment of women and their roles in the society. Smt. Sharma in her speech praised MSS's works and its presences among the marginalized as she experienced one of the SHGs she had visited in the target area that the women's are coming forward and joining the SHGs and are able to save and spent their earnings for their needs. She also said first they use to depends on their family heads but now they became strong and self-reliance with the support of SHGs. Thereafter, Mrs. Saroj Malik spoke that today the women have improved their status in the society a lot and need to improve further and she is hopeful that in the near future, the women will hold 50% of important posts and rights as men in the world.

The girls of village Meerpur presented a skit highlighting the issue of prevailing dowry system which imparted a good lesson to the gathering.

Another prominent speaker Mrs. Sushma Jakmola of Kotdwar expressed that the women should work and raise their voice unitedly for their rights and equality and achieve the objectives without violence. She also emphasized that the women should take a strong stand for themselves whatever the situation persist and thus the empowerment is possible.

At the end the Director Rev. Fr. John Chiman delivered his speech concluding and thanking all the distinguished guests and others who have come from far away villages spending their time and money for making the program very successful and memorable.

Similarly celebrations of International Women's Day were organized both at Bachraon and Kazikhera units also on different dates in the month of March 2016.



The group members also celebrated Girl Child Day, Independence Day of India, Republic Day of India, HIV/AIDS Day, Environment Day, Breast feeding Day etc. throughout the project area to create awareness among the target group about the importance of these days. Village presidents, committee members and school teachers were also participated in these programs to boost the spirit of group members on the importance of each program.

Micro Insurance Program:

This program meant for the poor villagers started five years back has been moving ahead as the number of policy holders during the reporting period has risen.

Summer Dance Program:

The first year program of 3rd Batch of Summer Dance Course was started on 25th May 2015 and ended on 20th June 2015. It is a residential three parts course organized by MSS in three years during summer holidays. Total 43 girls from different parishes of the Diocese participated in the first year part. The same girls will attend the second and third parts next year and thereafter to complete the full course. Both the inaugural and



concluding ceremonies of the first year program were blessed by the Bishop Rt. Rev. Francis Kalist. During the course of the program three dance instructors were recruited from outside. The expenditure incurred for this program was born by the Diocese of Meerut.

Scholarship to poor students of the Diocese:

Under the Diocesan Golden Jubilee Education Scholarship Fund program, during the reporting period an amount of Rs.73,100/- had been donated by various people including the beneficiaries, while Rs.12,84,000/- had been disbursed to deserving students to do their vocational/professional studies such as Nursing, B. Ed., Secretarial course, ITI, Computer training, etc. during this year. Total **120** students benefited under this program during the year 2015-16. The scholarship amount was born by the Diocese and MSS carried out the secretarial part of this program.

CORE GROUP POLIO PROJECT SUPPORTED BY C.R.S.

MSS is engaged in Polio Eradication program in 4 blocks of Saharanpur district. These blocks are Saharanpur City, Sunhety, Sarsawa and Nakur. The project's main objective is to motivate the public for polio eradication and immunization. In this work 54 CMCs, 5 BMCs, 1 MIS and 1 DMC are employed. Mobilization activities are done at the ground levels which are as follows:

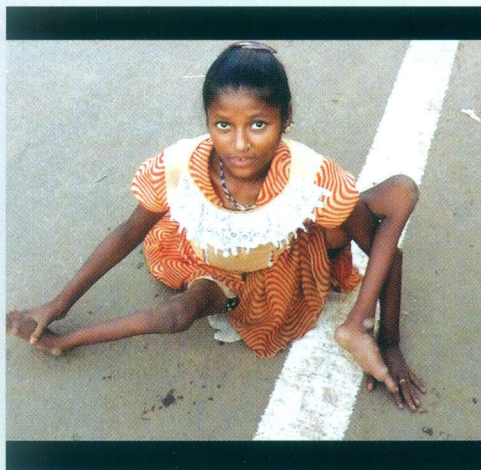
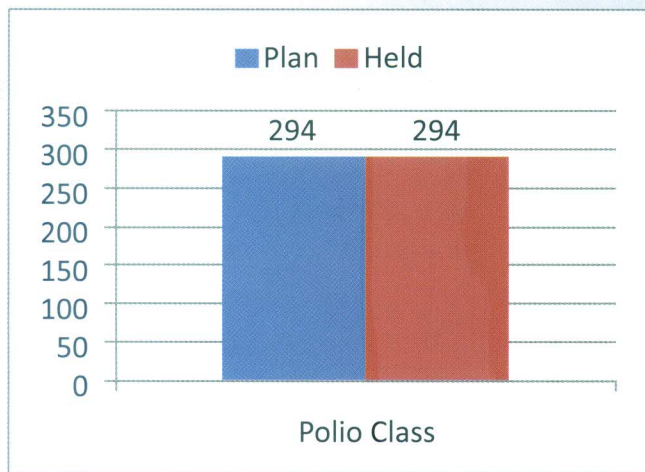

Polio Eradication Program:

During the year 2015-16, under this project a total of 5 rounds of polio vaccine dispensations were organized, in which a total of 539512 children were immunized in the district out of which 20696 children were immunized by Meerut Seva Samaj. The task was done through initiating following activities at ground level.

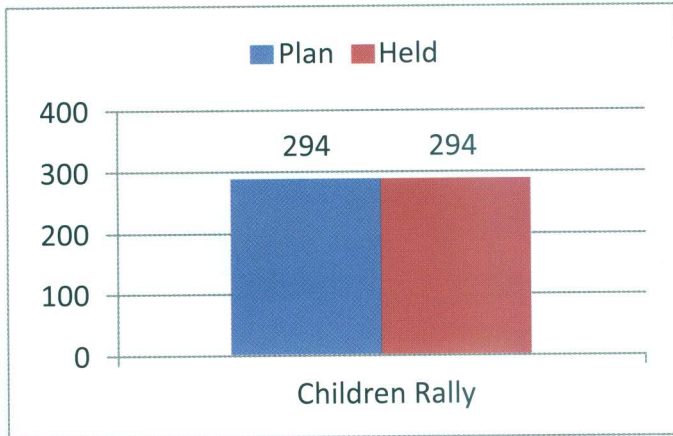
Polio Class:

Under this activity, children from the local schools are brought together to form a group which is known as Polio class. Through play we teach them how to keep cleanliness and taught how to prevent spreading of polio. 294 Polio classes were done in the year 2015 – 16 in which 5880 children took part.



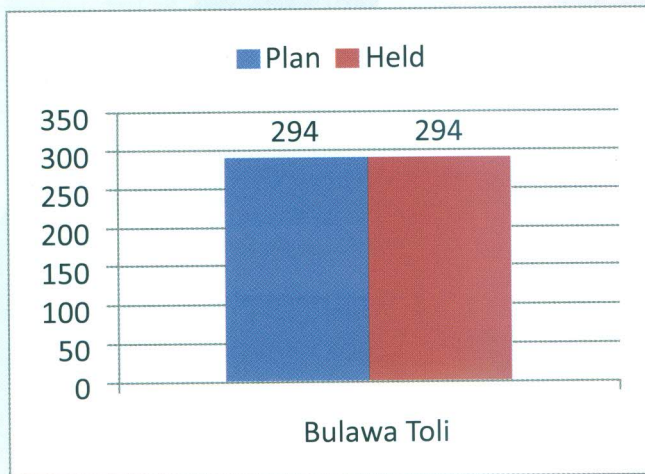
Children's Rally:

In the year 2015 – 16, five polio rounds were done. To make awareness in the area, just before 1 day of the round 294 Children's Rallies were organized so that people may come with their children for immunization to the booth. 5880 children took part in the rallies.



BulawaToli:

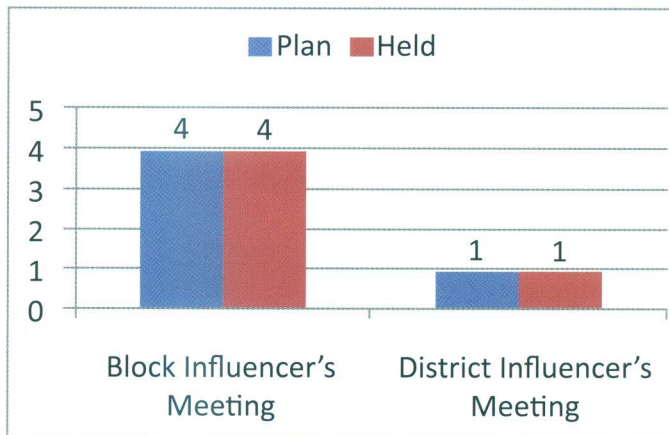
Bulawa-Toli is organised so that more and more children are immunized on booth day. Bulawa-Toli is made by gathering children between the ages of 8 to 10 years. These Bulawa Toli children call other children from their house so that maximum number of children may get immunized. In the year 2015–16, 294 Bulawa Toli programs had been made in which 2940 children had taken part.



Influencer's Meeting:

To avoid resistance in any area and to promote awareness of polio, local influencers have a great role to play. In year 2015 – 16, 4 block level influencers meetings and 1 district level influencers meeting were planned and organized. In block level influencers meeting, 3

influencers per CMC have invited and in District level influencers meeting, 2 influencers per CMC have invited. The purpose of this program is to make awareness and help people come forward in large number to get their children immunized.

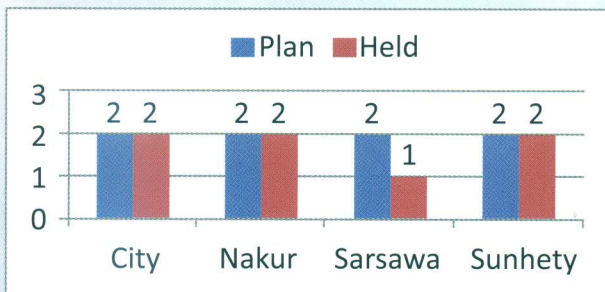


R.I. Strengthening Programs:

By the help of this program we provide medical helps in those areas where there are no health centers. In this program we distribute medicines and other health related things by organising health camps in those areas which are out reached. If some children are left unimmunized in the round, they are immunized in these health camps. Blood tests, Urine tests, weight measurements of pregnant women etc. are also done in these health camps.

Community Meeting:

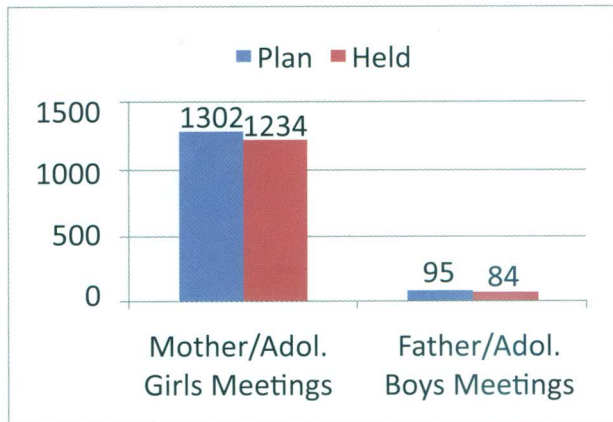
Community meeting is done in each village to improve the health and sanitation in villages as per the guide lines of Government of India. MSS organised such type of meetings in all the villages in all the four blocks. As a result of these meetings the committees may get active and take the responsibility of health and sanitation in their village. In year 2015 – 16, we have organised 7 community meetings.



Mother/ Father/ Adolescent Girls/ Boys meeting:

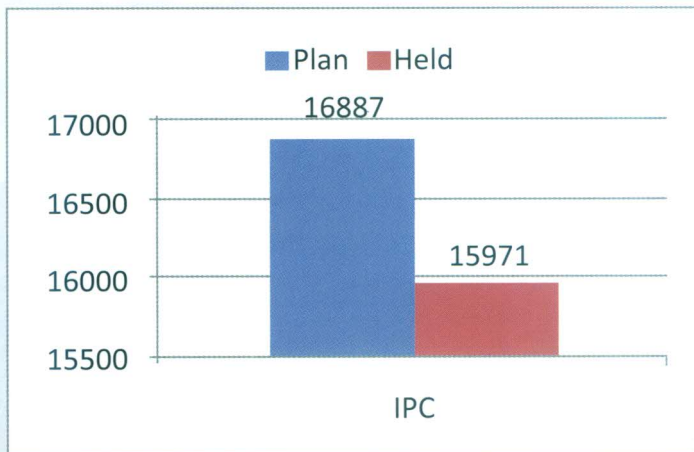
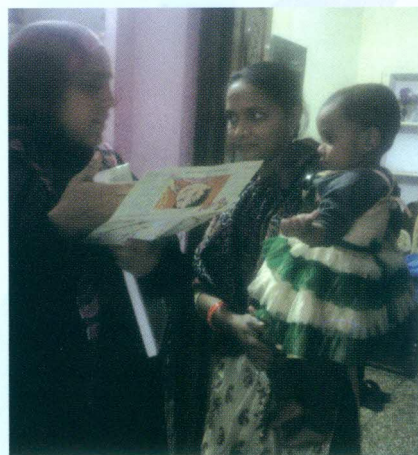
The main purpose of this activity is to take out all the myths which are spread in the community and to make aware all the communities about the real facts. In this meeting

many people ask questions and gets aware about the real facts. In the year 2015 –16, total of 1234 mothers and adolescent girls meetings were organized in which 9872 persons were gathered. Similarly total 84 fathers/adolescent boys meetings were organised in which 672 persons participated.



Inter Personal Communications:

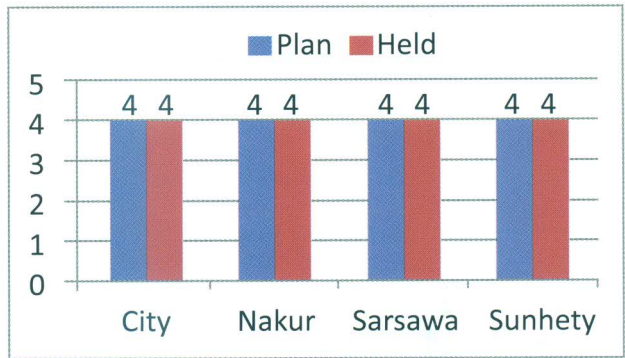
The main objective of this activity is to motivate the mothers to bring their children and other pregnant women for immunization. It is done between CMCs and mothers by visiting houses one by one. In year 2015 – 16, 15971 IPCs have taken place to create awareness of immunization among pregnant women.



Behaviour Change Communication Activities:

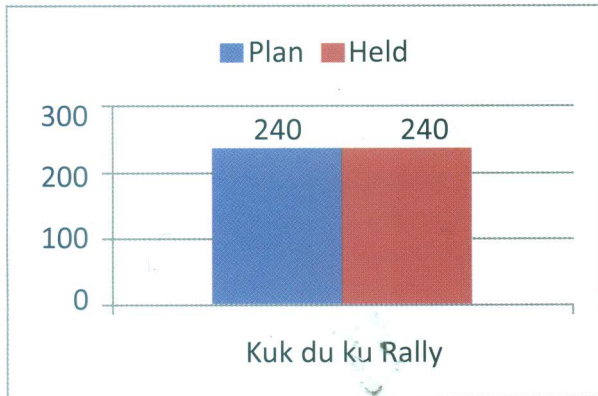
ASHA Coordination meeting:

This program is done to strengthen the AAA, i.e. ASHA, AWW & ANM along with the CMCs, so that they may provide better hospitality to the community by working in good coordination with each other for making due list, Mother and child tracking etc. In the year 2015 – 16, we have organized 16 ASHA coordination meetings.



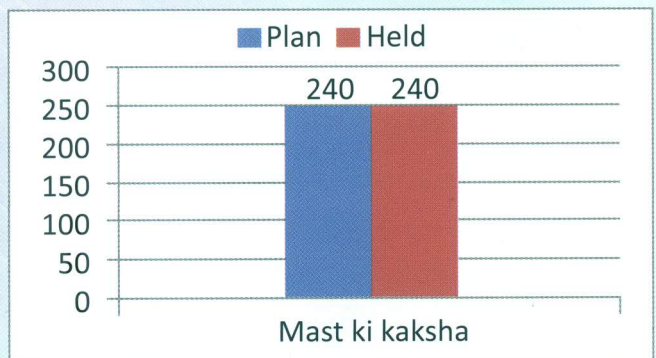
Kuk-du-ku Rally:

This program is conducted to promote the habit of using toilets, instead of going to open land for defecation. Through this activity we spread awareness about the need of permanent toilets. Kuk du ku rally is organized with the support of school children. In year 2015 – 16, total 240 kuk du ku rallies had been conducted, in which 4800 children took part.



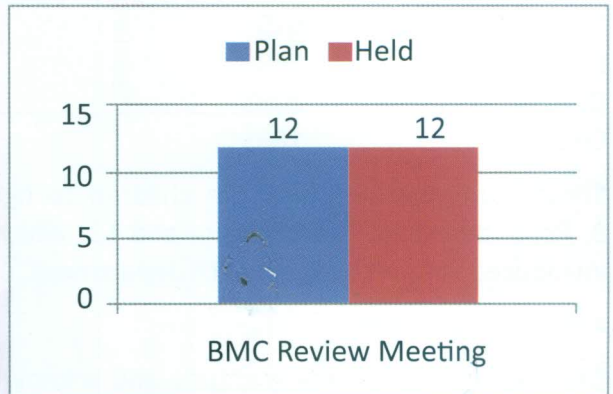
Masti-ki-kaksha:

This is a funny learning activity. In this activity we teach children that disposal of garbage must be done in the garbage bins and nowhere else. Teeth cleaning and hand wash is also a part of this activity. In year 2015 – 16, total 240 Masti ki kaksha program had been done through which 4800 children had been benefited.



BMC Review Meeting:

In this meeting all the polio staff take part along with the Director and Secretary of MSS. In this meeting we discuss all the key discussions of all 4 blocks. After discussion of the key points we discuss action points, in order to seek out the problem. We also do power point presentations from all the BMCs of all four blocks from which we can see how things are going in all the blocks. This activity is done to improve the capacity of all the staff. While BMC review meetings take place every month, the CMC review meetings take every fortnight which is limited with participation by concerned BMC only, unless urgency of DMC is needed.



Booth Inauguration:

Booth inauguration is done by the CMO & DIO. In this year in the month of February 2016, booth inauguration was done by which we were able to achieve above 90% coverage. Involvement of Education department officers, local influencers, local doctors and Imams was appreciated on that day.



Routine Immunization Session (Mission Indradhanush):



Mission Indradhanush was planned from October 2015 to January 2016 in our district, Saharanpur. It was planned by the government in some districts in which Saharanpur was one of them. Mission Indradhanush helped us get better coverage of all the antigens. It was planned in those areas where sub centers were vacant and where coverage was going down. Additional Health Director came to visit the CORE area and inspected the due lists and registers, and asked the CMCs about the procedure of making due list and registers and on what basis the registers are maintained and due list are prepared.

Training of Project staff:

Every year follow up trainings are organized for all the CMCs for updating the immunization methods/schedules. These trainings are imparted to the CMCs by the senior project staff after getting trained by CRS/CORE. This year also such trainings were given to all the CMCs. Also during the year all the new CMCs numbering 54 were given two days induction training in a city hotel to get them acquainted with the all the immunization methods.

Apart from polio vaccine, following are the details of other immunization administered to the children in the blocks during the year 2015-16:

These immunizations help the children to fight against Tetanus, Diphtheria, Hepatitis B, Polio, pertussis, Tuberculosis and J.E. which are all fatal diseases. Penta is a newly introduced vaccine by the health department.
