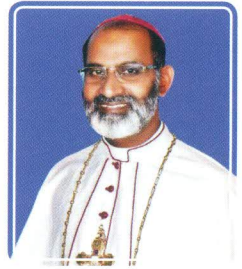

DURING THE YEAR 2016-17

MSS is deliberately executing its social responsibility through various activities of awareness, creation and mobilization in different sectors of rural development in the 14 districts of western U.P. to bring reforms in the living standard of the rural poor especially for women and adolescent girls through implementing different strategies such as formation of Women & Adolescent Self Help Groups, Capacity building programs, empowering women by delivering Skill trainings & income generation programs, creating platforms for promotion of education, enabling access to health services, assisting Govt. in Polio eradication & routine immunization of new born and pregnant women, disaster risk reduction through conserving environment & constructive measures, mobilizing the community for their rights and resources for opting various Govt. welfare schemes etc. throughout the year under different projects which are as follows:

PROJECT "SAKHI" APPROVED BY U.K.S.V.K., AGRA:

During its final year implementation, we have carried out the planned activities and achieved the projected outcomes for the betterment of adolescent girls in the target area of 10 villages of Rohta block district Meerut. Total 1380 have been enrolled in this project with the formation of 46 Adolescent Girls Groups. Many programs and trainings were conducted to deepen their knowledge and skills for their development. The three year project titled "SAKHI" (Strengthening Adolescents' Knowledge, Women's Rights & Health and Income) approved by Uttara Kendra Samaj Vikas Kendra (UKSVK), Agra has been successfully carried out its 11 objectives which is elaborated below:

Objective wise activities conducted during the period 2016-17 are as under:

Objective 1 - Promote adolescent girl leaders and strengthen girls' forum:

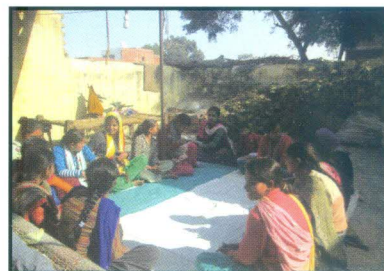
A 1. Monthly Meeting of Adolescent Girls' Groups:

46 Adolescent Girls' Groups have been formed comprising 1380 girls and regular 610 meeting on monthly basis have been organized.

Impact: Adolescent girls acquire knowledge & skills, capacity building, awareness on social and legal rights, promoting literacy, addressing health issues, life skills etc. making them more confident and to upfront their human dignity.

A 2. Networking meeting with teachers, parents and stake holders:

Two networking meetings were conducted in which 48 people participated.

Impact: Better coordination of girls with their parents, teachers and other key persons has been developed to provide equal learning opportunities,

Three interaction sessions has been organized which was participated by 52 women and girls.

Impact: Healthy interaction sessions of girls with village women were conducted which has ease the generation gap

A 1. Home visits of Adolescent Girls: In this year, home visit of 624 Adolescent girls were done by the project staff.

Impact: Good coordination of girls with their parents, more responsible towards their

daughters, friendly behavior, addressing their personnel and social problems, healthy environment in the family.

Two lobbying meeting with Govt. department were organized in which 57 Govt. workers participated.

Impact: They are sensitized on the effects and consequences of child marriage and sharing it to the community and opposing child marriage at their level.

A 3. Counselling of newly married couple: 19 newly married couples were counseled on natural family planning.

Impact: The married couples has agreed to adapt the natural family planning, gap between the children, pre & postnatal check-up, dealing problems with mutual understanding.

A 1. Sessions on Human body and its biological nature:

Six sessions were held in which 140 girls capacity built.

Impact: Girls are aware on the hormonal & biological changes occur in the body and they have overcome their anxiety and fear on the

A 1. Exposure visit to the Gov't Departments:

Two exposure visit were arranged which was participated by 100 girls.

A 3. Workshop on filing FIR, RTI, opening bank accounts:

Three workshops were organized with the participation of 143 girls.

Impact: Girls feel more self protective and opposing harassment and have become more outgoing. They are gathering information of Gov't department through RTI act and enhancing their knowledge. More than

100 girls have opened bank accounts and doing saving.

Objective 5 - Stay in School Concept:

A 1. 'Girls Friendly Session' with parents, teachers and girls:

Four triangular meetings were held in which 119 people participated.

Impact: The people understood the importance of education and they are sending their children to school. They appealed for better infrastructure in the school and proper toilet facilities. 26 readmission of dropout girls were done in this period.

Impact: Teachers ensured delivering quality education, equal learning opportunities to the girls with gender discrimination, proper sanitation in the school premises and motivating girls for better performance in their studies.

Objective 6 - Legal literacy and advocacy campaign "Me and My Friend":

A 2. Training on "Domestic Violence Act 2005":

12 trainings were conducted which was participated by 344 adolescent girls.

A 1. “Life Skill” session for boys:

Nine sessions on Life Skill were carried out which was participated by 240 boys

Impact: Boys are adapting moral and social values, developing their personality & friendly behaviour and positive thinking resulting in good learning environment in school.

133 Door to Door visits of Adolescent Girls were done by the project staff.

Impact: Girls shared their social & personnel problems with the staff and they addressed their problems & issues with coordination of their parents through counseling and needed action.

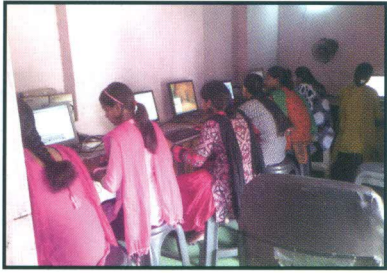

EMANCIPATION OF RURAL WOMEN AND ADOLESCENT GIRLS IN 36 VILLAGES IN MEERUT AND BAGHPAT DISTRICTS APPROVED BY MANOS UNIDAS, SPAIN:

The second year of this project has been implemented successfully for strengthening women and adolescent girls for their various rights and entitlements meant for them and the outcomes and results achieved under this project are as follows:

- 76 women's Group and 33 Adolescent Girls Group have been formed consisting 2025 women and 660 Adolescent Girls and having regular meetings.

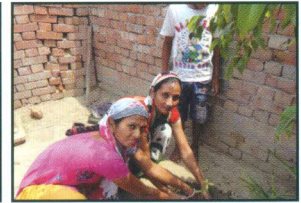

EMPOWERMENT OF RURAL WOMEN AND ADOLESCENT GIRLS IN 12 VILLAGES OF SAMBHAL DISTRICT

While recognizing the development work carried out by MSS in Meerut & Baghpat district, Manos Unidas kindly approved another project in Sambhal district aiming for upliftment of rural women and adolescent girls of the area. This project has been started from June 2016. The project activities has been implemented under this project is as under:

ECOSYSTEM BASED DISASTER RISK REDUCTION PROJECT SUPPORTED BY CARITAS INDIA:

Project Ecosystem based disaster risk reduction funded by Caritas India for the vulnerable ethnic groups for the villages those are more prone to flood. These 11 villages remains in two blocks Laksar and Khanpur under the Haridwar District. Since the project commenced from September 2015, the focus is on strengthening the Ecosystem by reducing the risk of disaster and at the same time to improve the livelihood opportunity to the poor people living in the area.

Activities conducted under the project throughout the year 2016 - 17 are as follows.

➤ **A.1.1. Networking meeting with Govt. department & other stakeholders.**

3 meetings has been conducted for building cordial relation with Government dept through organizing community level meetings.

➤ **A.1.2. Awareness to the community to protect the Natural resources through street play on “safe environment”.**

11 street plays one in each village was organized in project area by “Ritu Natya Kala Manch”. Through the plays we have managed to sensitize the villagers on occurrence of disaster due to environment change, pollution and role of nature. 1400 approx. villagers have been participated in the program.

Impact: of this activity was visible on the populace participated. They committed to prevent natural resources through promoting various activities like tree plantation, depleteing the use of chemicals in their agriuctureal land, proper management of wastage and keep environment clean. The community also give their support in planting the samples on the bank of river, making vermin composte bed in their agricultural field etc.

Impact: of this activity, that the community have become aware on the activities before and during the flood. Community now learned things to be more concern about at the vulnerable situations.

We had completed training for 10 farmer club training on organic farming and in this activity about 319 farmers participated. The trainings was imparted by KVK (Krishi Vigyan Kendra) and ATMA (Agriculture technology and management agency).

Impact: of the activity was farmers were sensitized and started practising organic manures through building 18 compost bed in our target area.

➤ **A.2.4 Training of Task forces on emergency management (rescue, relief and first aid)**

A rapid action team namely task force has been formed in the target area. The main duty of this 15 members team is rescue, relief and first aid during and after the flood.

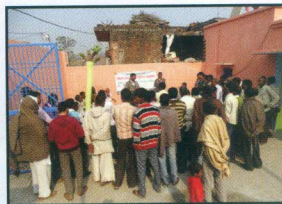

Mrs. Brijesh belongs to Bhola village and she has three children. Her financial condition is not so good and her husband is a daily wage labourer. All the family goes in the outfield for toilet. Our animator came across the beneficiary and told about the SHG concept and its advantages and encourages her to join the group and do the savings. In the monthly meeting Mrs. Brijesh came to know about the harmful diseases occur doing toilet in open and she decided to make a toilet in the house itself. But in absence of money she is unable to do so therefore she discussed it with the animator and she advised her to take loan from the group saving and the beneficiary followed the suggestion and the SHG group provided its support by sanctioning the loan and she installed a new toilet in the home and using it and also non polluting the environment.

- 2. Name of village : Kedwa**
Block : Binauli
Issue : Replacement of defective Transformer for supply of electricity

In village Kedwa, a transformer was damaged from last two and a half months in the area of lower caste community and the villagers were facing electricity problem. They had filed many complaints but no proper action was taken by the electricity department. On 5-7-16 the SHG members of Shiv Shakti along with the villagers approached to the District Magistrate and complained about the issue and he ordered the SDM to look into the matter. The frustrated villagers and SHG members filed written complaint to replace the transformer of high capacity to SDM on 4-08-16 and he assured to change the transformer as early as possible. The new transformer was installed on 5-9-16 and electricity restored.

- 3. Name of village : Alipur**
Block : Sardhana
Issue : Fear and hesitation to come out from home and take part in project activities

Km. Anshu Chaudhary is a very simple girl and she is very reserved and shy. She even fear talking to male persons and to go out in the village. Our animator Smt. Sunita contacted her and told to join the adolescent group and she joined the group and also received training on beautician for six months. Her personality was developed during the monthly meetings conducted. Now she gives tuitions to children and do beautician in the village and earning Rs.4000/- per month and she is becoming bold and outgoing. She is very thankful to MSS for providing the opportunity to be a part of the project and she is very happy.

- 4. Name of villages : Azampur**
Issue : Education - Drop out
Block : Rohta

Ms. Maneefa belongs to muslim family and she has two sisters and brothers. Her family is poor and therefore they did not continue their studies after VIII and also told that no importance is given for educating the girls in muslim community. But the girls want to study further and she has been associated with the program from last one and a half years but she thinks that various NGOs comes and only finish their target. But our animator Ms. Seema motivated the girls to form the groups and focused on the education of girls. Due to regular mobilization a girl namely

Anita continued her studies. Getting inspired from Anita, Maneefa also discussed the matter in the groups and the group supported her through their savings. Now she is doing her further studies and says that who helps themselves, God helps them.

- 5. Name of village : Nagli Azmabad**
Block : Rohta
Issue : Water logging in Main Street

A pond is located in the path of Dr. Rekha house and the rain water harvested is being outflow to the field for cultivation. But some dominant person has blocked the drainage due to which the rain water overflows to the main street and it is very difficult for the villagers to go out. On 10-08-16, women SHG meeting conducted a meeting and discussed the matter to take proper action. Mrs. Neetu W/o Mr. Trilokchand gave written note to the newspaper and also informed the issue to the block level. All the members of SHG went to the police station on 25-8-16 and lodged the complaint against the person who has blocked the drainage. Police went with the women on the spot and warned the person and removed the sand bags and restored drainage system.

Director MSS welcomed all the dignitaries, guest of honor, chief guest & audience for their kind presence. Thereafter a beautiful prayer song was sung by the girls of St. Peter's School

CORE GROUP POLIO PROJECT SUPPORTED BY C.R.S.

CORE GROUP POLIO PROJECT is working in Saharanpur district in 4 blocks respectively City, Sunhety, Sarsawa and Nakur. The project's main objective is to motivate polio eradication and immunization. Under our City Saharanpur 18 villages and 20 urban wards (HRA) is being covered. In this work 54CMCs, 5 BMCs, 1 MIS and 1 DMC are employed. Mobilization activities are done at the ground levels which are as follows:

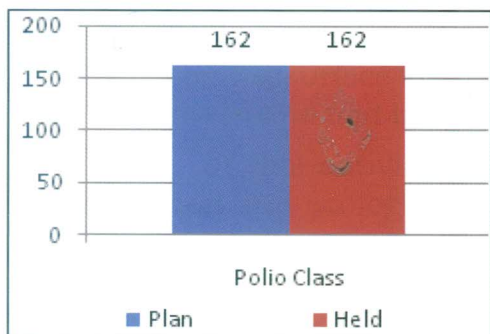

Polio Eradication Program:

With our deliberate efforts, we have made India polio free which was announced by W.H.O. on 27th March, 2014. In year 2016-17, under this program a total of 3 rounds of polio were organized, in which a total of 5,67,993 children were immunized in the district out of which 20,044 children were immunized by our organization Meerut Seva Samaj. To accomplish the task, the following activities at ground level were carried out:

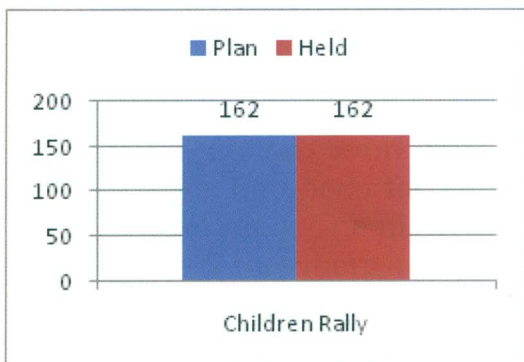
Polio Class:

Under this activity, children from the local schools participate to organise a group which is known as Polio class. Through plays, we taught them how to keep cleanliness & how to prevent polio disease is advised. 162 Polio classes were organized in which 3240 children took part.



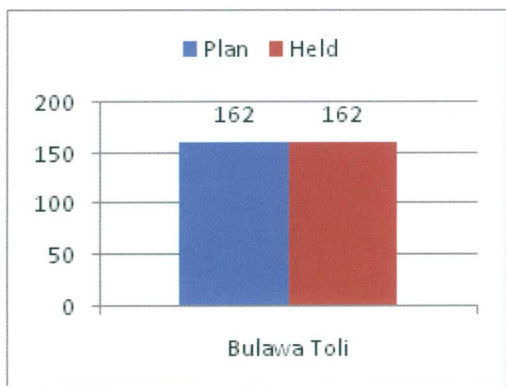
Children Rally:

Three polio rounds were done till the month of March 2017. To make awareness in the area, just before 1 day of the round, 162 Children Rallies were conducted so that people may come to immunize their children on the booth. 3240 children took part in the children rally.



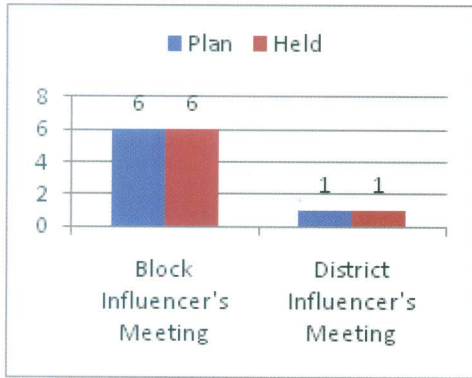
Bulawa Toli:

Bulawa Toli is made for the reason so that more and more children must get immunized on booth day. Bulawa Toli is made by gathering children between the ages of 8–10 years to call other children from their house so that maximum amount of children may get immunized. 162 Bulawa Toli have been conducted in which 1620 children participated.



Influencer's Meeting:

To make our program successful, influencers has a great role. To avoid resistance in any area and to promote the awareness for polio, local influencers have a great role to play. In year 2016 – 17, 4 block level influencers meeting and 1 district level influencers meeting are planned & will be organised, in block level influencers meeting 6 influencers per CMC will come and in District level influencers meeting, 2 influencers per CMC will come. The purpose of this meeting is to make awareness and help people get immunized.

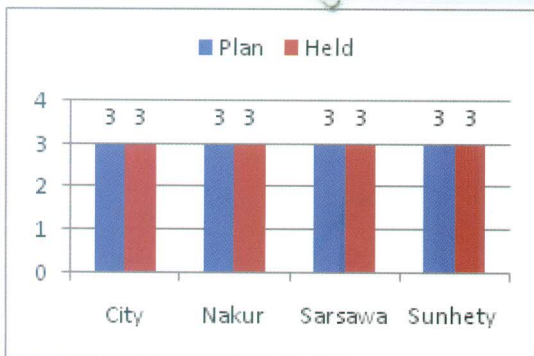


R.I. STRENGTHENING PROGRAM:

By the help of this program we provide medical helps in those areas in which there are no such kind of health centres. In this program we distribute medicine and other health related things by organising health camp in those areas which are out reached. Some children, who are left unimmunized, are immunized in these health camps. Blood tests, Urine test & weight measures for pregnant women are also done for free in the health camps.

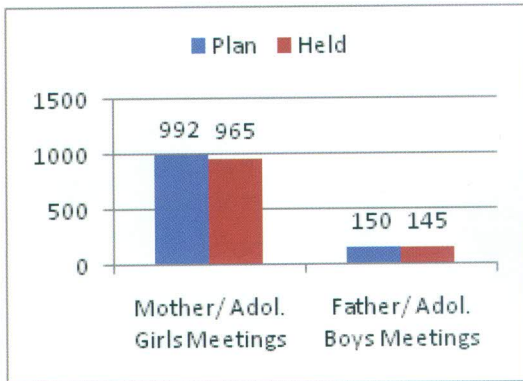
Community Meeting:

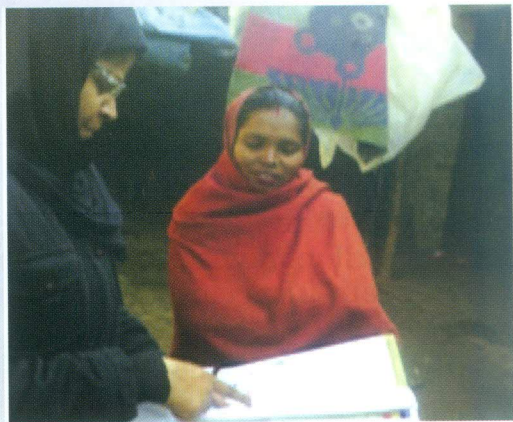
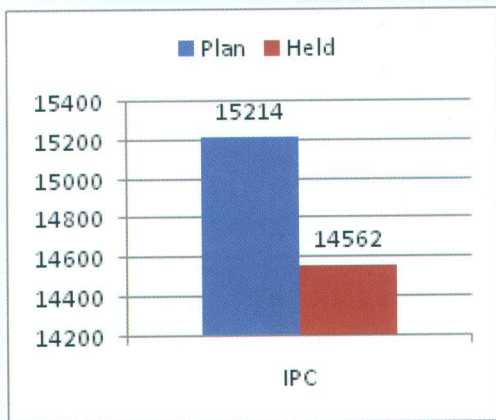
Mother/ Father/ Adolescent Girls/ Boys meeting:

Inter Personnel Communication (I.P.C.):

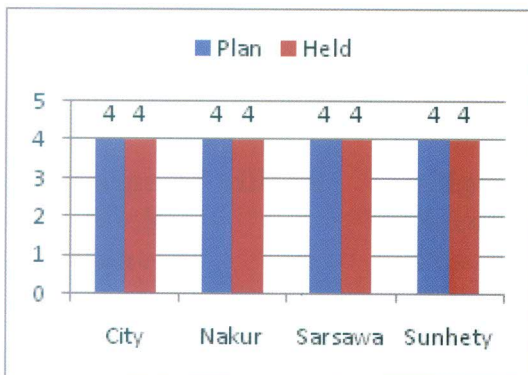

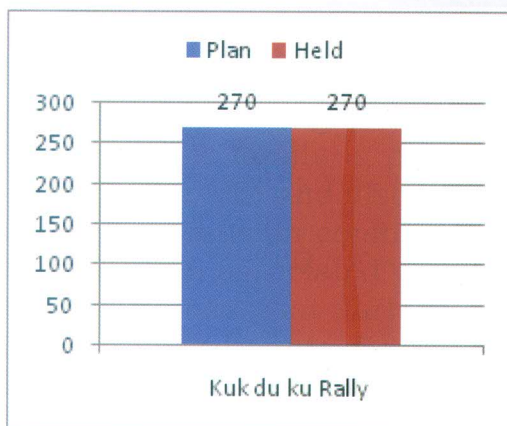
ASHA Coordination meeting:

Such as, making due list, Mother and child tracking etc. In year 2016 – 17 we have organized 16 ASHA coordination meetings till the month of March 2017, in which 72 ANM, 85 ASHA, 140AWW and 54 CMCs took part.



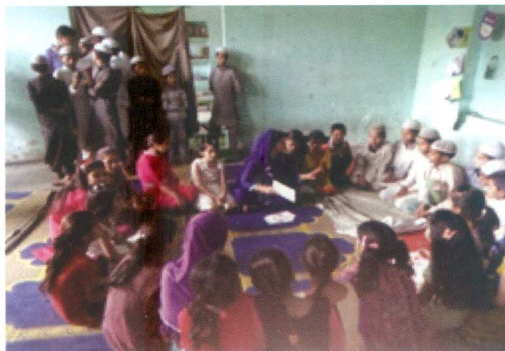
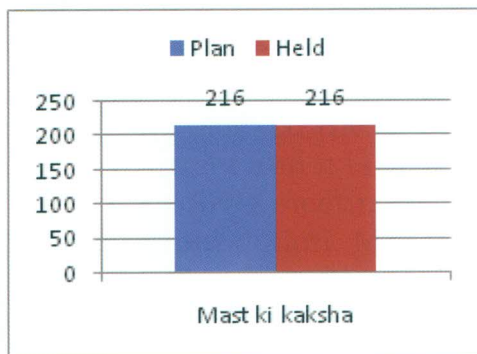
Kuk-du-ku Rally:

This rally is conducted to promote the habit of doing toilet in the permanent urinals instead of doing it in open land. In this activity we spread the awareness of permanent toilets by making a kuk du ku rally which is made by school children. In year 2016 – 17, total 270kuk du ku rallies have been done till the month of March 17, in which 5400 children has taken part.



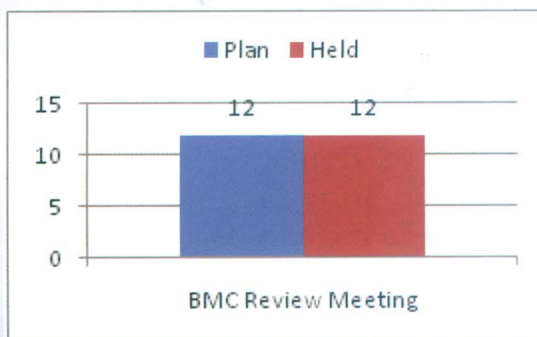
Mastikikaksha:

This is a fun learning activity; in this activity we teach children that disposal of garbage must be done in the garbage bins and nowhere else, teeth cleaning and hand wash is also a part of this activity. In year 2016 – 17, total 216 Mastikikaksha have been done till the month of March 2017, in which 4320 children have taken part.



BMC Review Meeting:

In this meeting all our staffs takes part along with the Director – MSS, & Secretary – MSS. In this meeting we discuss all the key discussions of all 4 blocks. After discussion of the key points we discuss action points, in order to seek out the problem. We also do power point presentations from all the BMCs of all four blocks from which we can see how things are going in all the blocks. This activity is done to improve the capability of all the staff.



Booth Inauguration:

Booth Inauguration is done by the CMO & DIO. In this year in the month of January 2017, booth inauguration was done by which we were able to achieve above 90% coverage. Involvement of Education department officers, local influencers, local doctors and Imams was appreciated on that day.



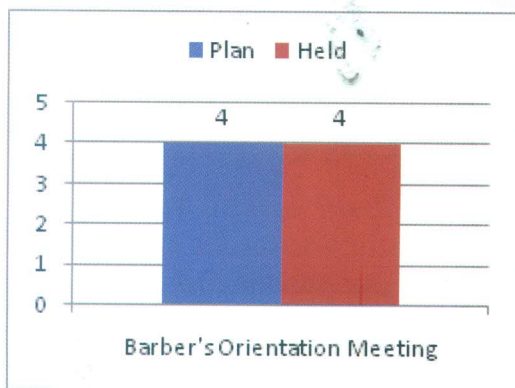
Training of Project staff:

Every year follow up trainings are organized for all the CMCs for updating the immunization methods/schedules. These trainings are imported to the CMCs by the senior project staff after getting trained by CRS/CORE. This year also such trainings were given to all the CMCs. Also during the year all the new CMCs number 54 were given two days induction training in a city hotel to get them acquainted with the all the immunization methods.



Barber Orientation:

It was observed that the participation of men is nil in comparison to women during the routine immunization. To improve the participation of men and to aware them on importance of immunization, village barbers were identified and mobilized. This work was initiated by the CORE in the financial year 2016-17 during which it was seen that 82 barbers in the four blocks of the Saharanpur area were groomed about the importance of vaccination and it was a good start to increase the participation of men in the field of immunization.



Hunger & Disease Campaign:

During the reporting year an amount of Rs.3,77,877/- had been donated by different institutions located in the Diocese towards this important program while an amount of Rs.4,38,871/- has been disbursed to the Hunger & Disease Wing of Caritas India and 74 deserving sick and needy people of the Diocese as per recommendations of the concerned parish priests.

The second year residential program of 3rd Batch of Summer Dance Bharatnatyam Course was successfully carried out from 24th May 2016 to 18th June 2016. There were 41 Girls from different parishes of Meerut diocese completed the second year course during their summer vacation. Thorough this opportunity, many girls of our diocese have opted Bharatnatyam as a career and are employed in different educational institutes.

The inaugural and closing ceremonies of the programs were blessed by the Bishop Rt. Rev. Francis Kalist. During the course of the program three dance instructors were recruited for teaching the course. The expenditure incurred for this program was borne by the Diocese of Meerut.

Scholarship to poor students of the Diocese:

Under the Diocesan Golden Jubilee Education Scholarship Fund program, during the reporting period an amount of Rs.1,67,990/- had been donated by various people including the beneficiaries, while Rs.14,47,000/- had been disbursed to deserving students to do their vocational/professional studies such as Nursing, B. Ed., Secretarial course, ITI, Computer training, etc. during this year. Total **133** students benefited under this program during the year 2016-17. The scholarship amount was born by the Diocese and MSS carried out the secretarial part of this program.

Conclusion:

In year 2016 – 17, 1788 children vaccinated for Hep B birth dose, 4750 children for BCG, 2040 children for DPT & Penta, 4576 children for OPV with the facilitation of Meerut Seva Samaj. These immunizations help them fight against Tetanus, Diphtheria, Hepatitis B, Polio, pertussis, Tuberculosis & J.E. which are all fatal diseases. We feel delightful to carry out the immunization of the children and making the future of India healthy.




